
GREETINGS FROM YOUR TUTORS!

TIPS BEFORE COMING TO FINLAND - Note you don't have to remember all these things, we'll get back to these also together during autumn.

Currency: Euro (use <u>xe.com</u> to convert currencies)

Time zone: UTC+2 (UTC+3 in summer)

Calling code: +358

Plugs: Types C and F (C = two round pins, F = two round pins with two earth clips on the side).

Standard voltage is 230 volts, 50 Hz.

Residence permit

Students coming from countries outside of the European Union should visit the Finnish Immigration Service website: https://migri.fi/etusivu

In addition to the residence permit, a student from a non-EU country needs to have valid health insurance issued by a reliable company or institution.

Visa and Connectivity

Apply for a Schengen visa through VFS.

Buy a local SIM. Preferably a data card that allows unlimited internet and local calls for a limited period. My card was for 7.50 Euros. Wi-Fi in Finland is fast and usually FREE in public spaces

Finland is very tech-savvy. WiFi is great in Finland, so you won't have a problem staying connected during your Finland vacation.

Weather

You never really know what the weather is going to be like in Finland. The summer can be 20-27 degrees Celsius (68-80 Fahrenheit) or 18 degrees (64 Fahrenheit). In winter, take as much warm clothing as you can, and follow the guide of what to wear in Finland:

Language

It is great to know the <u>basic Finnish words and sentences</u>: <u>https://en.biginfinland.com/basic-finnish-phrases-words/</u> If someone talks back in Finnish, you can always switch since the Finns have a great command of the English language and they'll acknowledge the effort.

Housing

In order to apply for accommodation you need to contact the Student Housing Company, Joensuun Elli. Fill in the application form online: https://joensuunelli.fi/ Read more tips from New Students https://www.karelia.fi/en/new-students-guide/#housing

Note that doors have separate locks and handles and if you close your apartment's door it will be locked. Always remember to take your keys when closing the door.

In Finland, biowaste, cardboard, glass, metal, hazardous waste and mixed waste are sorted separately.

Prices

Finland is a more expensive country than, let's say, Germany or Spain, but is cheaper than the other Nordic and Scandinavian countries. There is also a brimming culture of second hand shops. Talking about food, the difference for most items isn't that big and you can even find things that are a bit cheaper than in other countries. Finland's tap water ranks as some of the best in the world so there is no need to waste money and time buying bottled water.

Transport costs around 50€ for a train that takes you out of the city and covers a 400km distance.
